PETE'S PEN -

This month is notably significant in a number of ways. Five years ago, in September of 2018, we celebrated our ribbon cutting ceremony and the grand opening of Niagara Christian Gleaners (NCG). It marked the completion of our brand new facility and the beginning of equipment and dryer trials. In order for us to facilitate those trials we needed to acquire our first fresh produce from the growers. With the assistance of our Produce Acquisition Team, the work of grower networking was about to begin. I recall those early days when I would visit potential growers and explain the goals of NCG and what a grower partnership could look like. Some were aware of the Gleaners from their experience with the other Ontario gleaning operations. Many, however, had never heard of gleaning and were actually rather skeptical about the concept. Admittedly, we had a pretty humble start with the food donations, taking a few bins at a time, of whatever we thought would be suitable to dehydrate. We knew that we had work to do as we built trust relationships with the growers. It was up to us to prove that we were doing exactly what we said we would do with the food donations that they were entrusting to us. Fast forward five years and so much has changed from those early days. Our grower relations are stronger than ever and we've been so blessed by their generosity. In essence, the growers are the real givers and NCG simply transforms their food donation into stable nutritious food aid. Once dehydrated, their food can now be readily, and economically, shared nearly anywhere in the world where the need is greatest.

Since those early days of sporadic and often







smaller donations, we now manage multiple trailer loads of fresh produce in a single week. In fact, since our startup, we have received over 11 million lbs of amazing fresh fruit and vegetables. This translates into nearly 400 tractor trailer loads of produce coming from various growing regions in Southern Ontario. Last year we were also the benefactors of 9 trailer loads (500,000 lbs) of #1 PEI potatoes. With the willing and energetic hands of our amazing volunteers, we have prepared over 40 million servings of dehydrated food aid

since our plant doors opened! NCG continues to seek, and receive, the Lord's blessings on the work of the Gleaners. As we celebrate this season of thanksgiving, may we never lose sight of the

Lord of the harvest and offer to Him all glory and praise. "Our Lord, you have made your nation stronger. Because of you, its people are glad and celebrate like workers at harvest time or like soldiers dividing up what they have taken." Isaiah 9:3 - PW

TALLPOST CRAFT CIDER

Apple-picking time is in full swing, so what better time to feature one of our newest donors, Tallpost Craft Cider. In fact, apples may be fresh on everyone's mind as a 1-day Gleaning Event will be held at the orchards of Tallpost on October 7.

Tallpost Craft Cider, founded by Aaron Post in 2019, is "a cidery nestled in the heart of farmland" near Hamilton, Ontario featuring a variety of apples and pears. Their motto for their farm simply states they are "passionate in faith, quality and craft". In the short years since opening, the farm has quickly expanded from the cider operation (starting in a 40 ft. shipping container) on 7.5 acres to now 30 acres, including renting a nearby orchard. It continues to add farm attractions featuring sip and savour cider tastings and sales, fruit stand including field crops and vegetables, pick-your-own fruits, vegetables and flowers, corn pit, a hay castle and many small animals to pet and enjoy! There are many familyfriendly things to do while at the farm, at the same time educating visitors to see where their food comes from and how it gets from farm to table. Aaron is very excited to follow the path of the

surplus apples that will be picked by many volunteers at the 1-Day Gleaning Event, to having them chopped, diced and dehydrated at the NCG by even more volunteers there. He then hopes to follow closely by recording where the product ends up on an international level. "It will be interesting to track the fruits of our labours," he says. He hopes to hold this event for many years to come, blessing those along the way who have given of their time and efforts to get the product out and also to those who so desperately and humbly receive it.
